


Larni Yirrip

Dja Dja Wurrung Camping Village



The Victorian State Government is investing \$105.6 million over four years in Victoria's Great Outdoors (VGO) Program. As part of this, Bendigo has received a \$2 million funded project to develop Larni Yirrip, a Dja Dja Wurrung Camping Village. Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation who are now trading as DJAARA are leading the delivery of the project in partnership with Parks Victoria.

Larni Yirrip, meaning home of the Ironbarks will be situated in the Bendigo Regional Park adjacent to No.7 Park in Kangaroo Flat. The campground design has been based around Dja Dja Wurrung traditional values, designed to create a space for community and sharing that is uniquely Dja Dja Wurrung in nature.

Site Design

The recently developed concept design features a site layout with supporting concept images, that has laid the foundation for the detailed design process. The design is site sensitive; it has been based around existing tracks and areas of past disturbance, minimising the need to remove vegetation. This will allow for an immersive Dja Dja Wurrung cultural experience in a thriving box ironbark forest.

Ten to fifteen low-impact tent-based campsites will be situated around a centralised space with a shelter, site information, toilet amenities, and designated shared fire pit and welcome ceremonial fire. Camping will be available through an online booking system.

The design also includes the development of a buffer zone between neighboring properties and the campground, adding an extra level of privacy for campers and local residents. It is expected that afterhours access to No. 7 Park and the campground will be managed with electronic boom gates. Once the campground is opened in late 2022, Parks Victoria rangers will be regularly patrolling, maintaining, and managing day-to-day operations.

Larni Yirrip has recently moved into the detailed design stage. The concept design, with site layout and the strategic vision fact sheets, can be found under the fact sheets tab at https://djadjawurrung.com.au/resources/.







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Campsite Plan 1:1000
